MOTION: Rep. Moss moved to approve the minutes of the January 31, 2012 meeting. The motion passed unanimously. Rep. Powell was absent for the vote.

H.B. 213 School Community Council Member Qualifications (*Rep. L. Perry*)

Rep. Wright moved to amend the bill as follows:

1. *Page 1, Line 15:*

► requires the membership of a school community council to include two or more parent or guardian members than the number of school employee members; and

2. *Page 3, Lines 64 through 74:*

64 (b) Except as provided in Subsection (4)(c):
65 (i) each school community council for a high school shall have six parent or guardian

- 66 members and { ~~five~~ four school employee members, including the principal;
and
- 67 (ii) each school community council for a school other than a high school shall have
68 four parent or guardian members and { ~~three~~ two school employee members,
including the principal.
- 69 (c) (i) A school community council may have a larger membership provided that the

{ ~~exceeds~~ than the number of school employee members.
- 71 (ii) A school community council for a high school may have a smaller
